

## HEART SEARCHING FOR PRAYER PREPARATION AND FILLING OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

"Search me, O God and know my heart, try me and know my thoughts; and see if there be any wicked way in me and lead me in the way everlasting." (Psalm 139:23)

### CONFESSION OF SIN IS NECESSARY FOR FELLOWSHIP WITH GOD AND A LIFE OF POWER IN THE HOLY SPIRIT.

As you go through this section confess your sins, and transfer them to the cross of the Lord Jesus Christ whose blood cleanses from all unrighteousness. Then, as Isaiah says, "...thine iniquity is taken away (i.e. guilt) and thy sin purged." (Isaiah 6:7) However, although we have confessed a sin, it will, many times, still come back to us; it is "mentioned in our hearts or minds" and we still feel guilt. What is the cause? Turn in your Bible to Ezekiel 33:14-16, and read it through, taking note of verse 16, 'None of his sins that he has committed shall be mentioned unto him...' Why? "He hath done that which is lawful and right..." What has he done that is lawful and right? The "lawful and right" things are listed in verses 14 and 15:

- 1) Turned from his sin (stopped)
- 2) Done what is right
- 3) Restored pledge (of Ezekiel 18:7)
- 4) Returned what was stolen, and
- 5) Walked in obedience to the Word

Therefore, many times we continue to bear the guilt of sins continuously mentioned to us because we have not made proper restitution or confession to the party offended. Now, if your sin has been physically demonstrated against someone, (i.e. nasty word, manifestation of impatience, lie, etc.) confess it to the party involved. But if it has been harbored in the mind without any physical manifestation to the party, only confess it to God. If there is still no release, you might confess the sin to a spiritual brother or sister following the injunction in James 5:16 to "confess your faults (singular in Greek) one to another and pray one for another, that you may be healed." Fault is "paraptoma" which means a falling aside when one should have stood; being or doing something that is strange to the goal of the Lord.

**NOW!** If your sins are still mentioned to you, and you have fulfilled what is lawful (according to the Word) and right, it is not God mentioning them **BUT THE ACCUSER OF THE BRETHREN, THE DEVIL.** Resist him refuse his accusations, and draw nigh to God. Start praising the Father for the cleansing of the blood and the promise of I John 1:9. As you confess each particular sin, name it for what it is, call it by name. Then ask yourself if you need to confess to anyone other than God and if you need to make

restitution. If you do need to make restitution, do not rest until it is done... check out the list above from Ezekiel.

Every great revival or spiritual awakening in history has come in answer to sincere prayer from clean hearts.

The purpose of this booklet is to aid you in opening your heart to the gaze of a loving, holy God. Only the Holy Spirit can bring true conviction of our sin (John 16:8). When our Lord Jesus Christ shows us our sin, it is not for the purpose of tormenting us; it is rather that we might feel the same way about specific sin as He does and that we might act accordingly. He wants to cleanse us.

When light (truth) comes, we have a natural tendency to draw back, to hide, or to justify ourselves. This tendency started back in the Garden of Eden when a fallen Adam hid from God (Genesis 3:8-10 and John 3:19-21). Spiritual freedom will come as we are willing to come into the light of God and accept our true condition before Him. We must not lie to light. Nothing about our true condition shocks God; He already knows. We must face the light and deal with our loving Saviour honestly.

As you go through the following questions, take your time. Do not treat these matters lightly. Find a quiet place where you may prayerfully listen to God. Look up every Scripture and let the Spirit of God search your heart and your mind.

Check the appropriate answer, "yes" or "no". Sin must be confessed and forsaken in order to enjoy fellowship with a Holy God and to be filled with His Spirit. Sin hurts God and it grieves the Holy Spirit.

"He that covereth his sins shall not prosper but whoso confesseth and forsaketh them shall have mercy." (Proverbs 28:13)" If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." (I John 1:9)

Following are some terms and their definitions which you need to understand:

**SIN:** It is independence from the control of God's Spirit; it is transgression of the law; it is to know to do good and to do it not. Sin is an attitude or a condition of the heart that results in an action.

**CONFESS:** To confess is to say the same thing about yourself that God says. It is looking at yourself in the light.

of His presence. The word, confess, literally means "to say with" or "to say with God the same thing He says about your sin."

**FORSAKE:** To forsake means to renounce and to have nothing further to do with a sin. It is to "burn my bridges, so that I do not return to that sin."

**FORGIVENESS:** Forgiveness is the releasing of negative feelings or responses against an individual, whether the individual has been right or wrong. Full forgiveness involves a positive aspect of healing in a relationship that was broken, and it also involves a forgetting of past wrongs.

**RESTITUTION:** When you make restitution, you make right those things that were wrong. Restitution is restoring a relationship or a situation to the condition it was before sin entered; it means returning stolen goods, returning borrowed things, and replacing what you damaged or took as earnest money; it means mending, as far as possible on your part, any broken relationships. Restitution must be made!

**CLEANSING:** After confession on your part, God will cleanse you in the precious blood of the Lamb. Confession and repentance are meant to bring you to faith as you praise Him for the cleansing blood. Will you make right the sin the Holy Spirit shows you? If so, God promises to cleanse.

Remember these three things:

1. If the sin is against God, confess it to God: then, make things right with God.
2. If the sin is against another person, confess it to God and to the other person; then, make things right with that person.
3. If the sin is against a group, confess it to God and to the whole group; then make things right with that group.

A good rule to remember is, "As wide as the sin, so wide should be the confession"

If there is full confession of sin, there will be complete cleansing. It is the precious blood of Jesus Christ which cleanses you from sin. not your own efforts or prayers. The joy of the Lord will follow. "Blessed are the pure in heart for they shall see God." (Matthew 5:8)

The purpose of this booklet is not to bring you under condemnation, but rather to bring you to a realization of unconfessed sin and, then, to repentance and confession. Godly sorrow for sin will lead you to confessing your sin and to forsaking it so that you might have unbroken fellowship with God.

Read this Scripture again carefully, asking God to show you what He means by "loving the world." So many Christians are so confused when it comes to defining worldliness. Many make worldliness a matter of legalism, externalism or negativism. This fact is shown in a code of decrees..."do not handle, do not taste, do not touch" (Colossians 2:21), but God says we are not to

submit to such man-made decrees. The" decrees have nothing to do with worldliness. Worldliness is sensualism. the lust of the flesh Worldliness is materialism. coveting what the eyes see. Worldliness is egotism, the pride of life which keeps drawing attention to self in numerous different way; or that makes us have to be number one.

Wordliness is also loving the things of this world which will pass away and, thus. setting your affection on these things rather than on Christ and eternal things. Worldliness is not. however. enjoying the things of this life for He has given us all things richly to enjoy (I Timothy 6:17). but rather worldliness is having the improper attitude toward these things. "If ye then be risen with Christ, seek those things which are above, where Christ sitteth on the right hand of God. Set your affection on things above not on things on the earth" (Colossians 3:1-2).
